


In my journey, I've learned that the greatest legacy one can leave is not just a thriving business, but a family empowered to break cycles and forge new destinies.

PART II: GROWTH

Mr. Potato Spread, since its inception at the end of 2014, has shown impressive growth in sales, as illustrated by the year-over-year figures. Testing our concept as a delivery only catering company from 2014 - 2016 allowed for the introduction of the food truck in 2016. We understood the importance of delivery with a concentration on businesses before there was an Ubereats or Doordash in Jacksonville.

We consistently expanded services, 2017 and 2018 and perfected our systems and processes for delivery and food truck operations. The opening of the first brick-and-mortar location in 2019 significantly increased sales that we were able to maintain in 2020 despite market challenges due to Covid-19. We were able to pivot quickly, changing our delivery model to homes and launch curbside delivery from our Regency Mall location. Additionally, the truck serviced neighborhoods in lieu of our previous business lunch truck model. Our employees were pivotal in assisting us with this pivot allowing us to keep them employed throughout the pandemic.

The year 2021 marked a substantial leap to \$1.1 million, coinciding with the opening of the Orange Park Mall location. Sales slightly dipped in 2022 with the introduction of a franchised location, but rebounded strongly to in 2023, following the relocation to the River City Market Place. This graph demonstrates the strategic growth and resilience of Mr. Potato Spread, showcasing the success of its expansion from a delivery-only service to a multi-location brand."




